Chairperson's Message

The area known as Mitcham Village was first settled in 1840 making it one of the first settlements to be established outside of Adelaide.

At the Society's 2021 Annual General Meeting, Judy Weaver asked how the Mitcham Historical Society Committee communicates with the Mitcham Council with respect to matters of heritage. She said that since the Council's Heritage Committee had been abolished at the end of 2014, there did not seem to have been any provision in Council budgets for the maintenance of signage particularly in the Mitcham Village. Subsequently, John Wood and I met with Judy where she outlined and reiterated her concerns expressed at the AGM and what she thought the Society could do in this regard.

In mid-February I undertook a comprehensive inspection of the interpretative and street signage as well as other items of historical/heritage interest in the Mitcham Village. All of these items reflected a lack of maintenance and many items such as the information screens on the interpretative signage were in need of replacement. Other items such as timber sign stands and frames and seats were in urgent need of oiling. A comprehensive report was provided to the Council and a maintenance programme has begun and a commitment been given to ensure regular inspection and maintenance of these items.

One of the Society's Objects is: to foster, create and maintain public awareness of the Mitcham Village and its history and without the proper maintenance of the signage and other items, visitors to the Mitcham Village cannot discover and learn of the historical and heritage significance of this part of Adelaide dating from shortly after European settlement. Whilst the historic signage is readable, the signs will be rectified as part of the Council's asset renewal programme for 2022-2023.

Chairperson's message cont'd/

Regrettably the Society's guided tour of Mitcham Village on 16 March had to be cancelled at the last minute due to the heavy rain that afternoon. The April bus trip to Auchendarroch House at Mt Barker and then Strathalbyn was a great success (*see separate report in this issue*) and our next event the Mid-Year High Tea in June is "sold out". We are hosting 4 walks as part of the 2022 History Festival – 2 each in Brownhill Creek Recreation Park led by Ron Bellchambers and in Ellison's Gully led by Councillor Andrew Tilley (*see separate report in this issue*).

Members may recall that in late 2020, the Society began speaking with a range of stakeholders about heavy freight vehicles on Cross Road and concerns that these volumes might increase as a result of the North South Connector. These concerns along with reducing HFV volumes on the SE Freeway have been taken over by a new group, <u>Our Roads SA</u> – the MHS Committee agreed to provide some seed funding to ORSA in the amount of \$250 plus the leftover funds from the "Save the Waite Gatehouse" campaign.

At its last meeting the Committee agreed that member should be canvassed about events, activities, visits they would like to see the Society host or organise. Comments about the timing of activities e.g. morning, afternoon, evening are welcome also. Please see page 11 for how to respond.

Guided walk: Ellisons Gully, Brownhill Creek History Festival 2022

The Society is hosting four walks as part of the 2022 History Festival two in Brownhill Creek Recreation Park and two in Ellisons Gully. Councillor Andrew Tilley (*pictured*) led the Ellisons Gully walk on Sunday 15 May with 22



participants. Andrew is a 5th generation resident of the area and is well versed in its history. The walk started at the old manure pits used by the early market gardeners in the area, before proceeding into Ellison's Gully. This area belongs to the Spencer family and has been cleared of the once rampant blackberries. Public access is permitted to this very scenic landscape rich in history. The upper reaches of Brownhill Creek are fed by springs meaning that water is flowing, unlike in the Creek's lower reaches at this time of year. There are some disused silver and galena mine shafts in the gully and many of the attendees took the opportunity to enter one of these. A feature of the area is the 140-year old Mitcham water works that once also supplied Unley and Adelaide. The original catchment area for the works has been uncovered and restored and as you follow the creek much of the original cast iron pipework imported from Scotland can be seen. One more walk in Ellisons Gully remains on Sunday 29 May and you can book here.

The Society is most grateful to Ron Bellchambers and Andrew Tilley, two of the most knowledgeable people in terms of Brownhill Creek its history, development and topography for giving freely and generously of their time to lead these walks.

April 2022 Bus Trip

On Sunday 10 April on a perfect autumn day we headed off up South Eastern freeway to Mt Barker and then onto Strathalbyn. The highlight at Mt Barker was a visit to Auchendarrach House. Where we were greeted by Michelle Berry and Michelle Wallis, CEO of the Wallis Corporation for morning tea in the Kelmscott Oakfield Room.

Michelle Wallis and Michelle Berry guided us through the house where all of the rooms featured William Morris wallpaper and curtains We toured through the Ballroom featuring William Morris wallpaper "Spring Thicket" pattern, the Barr Smith billiard room featuring "Honeysuckle and Tulips" wallpaper, and the Chrysanthemum dining room featuring "Chrysanthemum" wallpaper. Joanna Barr Smith's room features "Rose" wallpaper *ca.* 1890 (see opposite page) by Morris.

We were given a comprehensive history of the house from its beginnings in 1860 as the Oakfield Hotel established by Lachlan McFarlane, to the time *Robert Barr Smith acquired the property in 1878 and then acquisition by the Wallis family in 2000. The visit concluded with a tour of the beautiful gardens. Auchendarroch House is a great tribute to Michelle Wallis and her passion for the restoration of the house and her eye for detail. We then travelled on to Strathalbyn with Dr Anne Herraman's commentary and her amazing knowledge of the area. Lunch was taken at the historic Commercial Hotel which was established in 1865. After lunch we visited the Strathalbyn Historical Museum where members of the National Trust hosted our tour through the museum. A big thank you to Dr Anne Herraman our expert guide, and our volunteer bus driver Peter Williams. (reported by Ian Strout)

Adelaide's Public Transport – The First 180 Years

A book describing the history of public transport – trains, trams, and buses, in the area now served by Adelaide Metro, written primarily by Tom Wilson (a public transport planner with the Department for Infrastructure and Transport's predecessors, 1973-2010), has recently been published by Wakefield Press. The story of public transport in this large area – Gawler to Sellicks Beach and outward to Mount Barker, is long and complex. Hence, at 6,400 pages, it had to be published digitally on a USB stick. The book is set out in such a way that the reader can easily select the chapters that interest them. As well as text it includes thousands of photos, maps and diagrams etc. Reading it will assist in understanding why the system is the way it is, and many of the lessons that can be learnt from that history, so it should help those working in public transport.
