Chairperson's Report

Annual General Meeting 2021 - 2022

In October 2021 John Wood, Ian Strout and Sandy Matz attended the East Torrens Regional Seminar held at historic Marble Hill which is undergoing restoration by its owners Ed and Patricia Michell.

In December the MHS Committee agreed that the society should withdraw from the campaign to get heavy freight vehicles off Cross Road and out of the Adelaide Hills. A new organisation was formed, Our Roads SA to continue campaigning on this matter. Indeed, a number of us are actively involved with Our Roads. The primary objective (amongst other things) of the new organisation is: *The diversion of heavy road freight away from the South-Eastern Freeway and Adelaide's suburbs*.

In December also we made a submission on the revised draft Planning and Design Code – phase 3 and our submission included a specific section on Heritage. You may be aware that The Minister for Planning, the Hon. Nick Champion MP, has commissioned an independent panel of planning experts to conduct a six-month review of reforms to the planning system implementation, including:

- The Planning, Development and Infrastructure Act 2016
- the Planning and Design Code and related instruments, as it relates to infill policy, trees, character, heritage and car parking
- the ePlanning system, to ensure it is delivering an efficient and user-friendly process and platform
- the PlanSA website, to check usability and ease of community access to information.

We will be making a submission to that Review – if you have any thoughts, comments or ideas, please feel free to send them to me, and I will bring them to the attention of the MHS Committee.

Chairperson's Report cont'd/

In October we visited historic Urrbrae House where MHS Life Member, Glen Woodward conducted a guided tour. After the tour we took the opportunity to see the beautiful rose garden and then adjourned to The Ed for lunch.

Two bus trips: November 2021 Mt Lofty, Piccadilly, Stirling and Crafers. April 2022 -Mt Barker and Strathalbyn. Both of these trips had local historian Dr Anne Herraman as guide.

The 2021 Christmas Function at The Ed was well attended.

Mitcham Village walk in March – had to be cancelled due to the torrential rain on the afternoon of Wednesday 16 March.

In May for the History Festival 2022 we hosted two walks in the Recreation Park and tow in Ellison's Gully. Eventbrite was used for the first time for people to book for these walks, with some 80 people participated generating just over \$300.00 in income. A warm thank you to Ron Bellchambers and Andrew Tilley who, respectively, led these walks.

In June we hosted an incredibly successful Mid-Year High Tea in the Drawing Room at Torrens Park House (Scotch College) attended by 60 members and guests. A highlight was a talk by the College's honorary archivist, David Saies, who spoke about the Barr Smiths and Torrens Park House.

At the 2021 AGM member Judy Weaver asked about how the Society communicates with the City of Mitcham in respect of heritage matters – her question particularly had to do with the Mitcham Village. Subsequently, John Wood and I met with Judy where she outlined her concerns.

Chairperson's Report cont'd

I undertook two inspections of the signage and other things in the Mitcham Village. I then prepared a quite detailed report for the Committee which was endorsed and provided to the Manager, Engineering and Horticulture at the Council. Some action has been taken:

Water fountain repainted

Bus stop seats on Albert and Welbourne Street were oiled/ varnished.

All benches in Sutton Gardens and Mitcham Reserve oiled/ varnished

All jarrah bollards oiled/varnished

We were advised also that regular maintenance inspections/actions would be scheduled for the Mitcham Village. One of the bollards, at the corner of Albert and Welbourne Streets, is severely affected by termite damage and should be replaced.

However, the signs of which there are 12 have not yet had their information cover sheets replaced, despite assurances that the Council would endeavour to do this expeditiously.

There is also the issue of a tram pole in Welbourne Street – the pole is heritage listed and is still in use supporting electrical wiring. I am aware that SAPN who own the pole are or were planning to transfer it to the Council as they are not interested in its maintenance. This matter will likely be raised again at the first meeting of the new Council.

We are waiting on a status report with respect to these issues from the Manager, Open Space at the City of Mitcham. Rest assured we will continue to monitor progress on this.

Chairperson's Report cont'd

I am pleased to report that our membership has remained stable, and we have a few new members and the new Federal Member for Boothby (Louise Miller Frost MP), state member for Elder (Nadia Clancy MP), and state member for Waite, (Catherine Hutchesson MP) have joined as Corporate Members. For a small volunteer run organisation our finances are in a strong position.

I extend my sincere thanks to my fellow committee members for their dedication and hard work during the past 12 months. Thank you particularly to Peter Reeve who has been Minute Secretary and also looks after our website – Peter is at the pointy end of his PhD candidature at Flinders and has stepped back from the Committee for a year but continues to service the website. A sincere thank you also to Sandy Matz who stepped down as Treasurer – Sandy was also for a time both Treasurer and Secretary – Sandy continues as a member of the Committee. Lastly, my sincere thanks to you, our members, for without you and your support, the MHS would not exist.

I take this opportunity to extend my best wishes and those of the committee to all our members for a happy safe festive season.

NOVEMBER BUS TRIP Sunday 6 November

Highlights: National Motor Museum (Birdwood), historic Mt Torrens, Melba's Chocolate Factory (Woodside)

22 members and our bus driver, Peter Williams left the Mitcham Council car park for the trip to Woodside for the first stop on a surprisingly warm (27°) and sunny day. Even though it was early November the Adelaide Hills were still lush and green. At Woodside morning tea was taken at Lovells' Bakery with generous helpings of just made bienenstich (bee sting) cake. From Woodside we took the scenic route to Birdwood *via* Lobethal.

We were introduced to the National Motor Museum and its collections by knowledgeable, Andrew Applebee, Visitor Engagement Officer. A lot of history and a lot of memories. And the Museum grounds were hosting more than 100 Minis, Cooper Ss and Mokes!

Lunch was taken at the historic Mt Torrens Hotel in the heritage listed town of Mt Torrens. The hotel has been almost completely renovated by its current owners with much of its original timberwork returned to near original condition. After lunch Kaitlyn Lo-Faro (co-owner) spoke about the history of the hotel and its two ghosts.

The final stop on the journey through the hills was Melba's Chocolate and Confectionery in Woodside which features a vast range of chocolates and assorted sweets.
